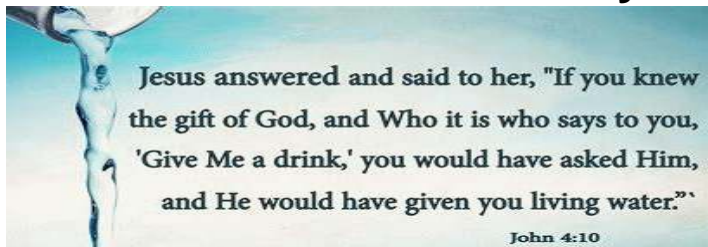

LENT REGULATIONS FOR CATHOLICS

All Fridays throughout the year, especially during Lent, are penitential days. All who have reached their 14th birthday are to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent. **St. Patrick Absolution Decree from Bishop DeGrood:** I hereby decree that those who participate in an event remembering Saint Patrick where meat is served are dispensed from the obligation to abstain from meat with the proviso that another form of penance be undertaken on Friday, March 17, 2023.
